Oregon or Bust The Oregon Trail The Oregon Trail opened in 1841 with 35 men, 5 women, and 10 children using it to make the trek from Independence, Missouri, to Oregon City, Oregon In 1842, 100 emigrants took that same westward trail In 1843, the number of people traveling increased to 1000
